Message from the Guest Editor

Bioactive compounds include a broad diversity of structures and functionalities that provide an excellent option for the treatment and prevention of human diseases, sustainable agronomic techniques, and for responding to the changing needs of today's society. However, these compounds are present in very low levels, causing inherent difficulties in their extraction and purification as well as the characterization of both their physicochemical and biological activity.
