Message from the Guest Editors

Monitoring is the key to understand the physics governing the non-thermal Universe. Although many sources are studied already in great detail over the entire electromagnetic spectrum, more information is required to further constrain the wide parameter space of emission models. Time-resolved energy spectra in all wavebands are crucial. This highlights the importance of any monitoring program, or more generally: Time-domain astrophysics. The workshop “Monitoring the Non-Thermal Universe” brings together experts from multi-wavelength and multi-messenger astronomy working on monitoring, observations, variability analysis, astro-statistics, data analysis and interpretation, and theoretical modeling. With this Special Issue of *Galaxies*, the current status is summarized, providing a unique and comprehensive reference on the importance of monitoring for the insight into source physics. It will serve as a common basis for future studies and projects.
