The scope of this Special Issue is to document the main ideas pertinent to migration and diaspora, historical and colonial trauma, ethnicity, nationality and citizenship, nationalism, national identity, indigenous communities, ethnic neighborhoods around the world, and local heritage studies (e.g., heritage events, carnivals, exhibitions of local artefacts, local and community museums, local archives, etc.).
