Significant attention has been paid recently to the power of stories in our lives. A rise in storytelling is apparent from books like "The Science of Storytelling" (Storr, 2020) and "How to Tell a Story" (Bowles et al., 2022) and the popular radio show The Moth and their live story slams.
