The Manifestation and Contestation of White Privilege in Multiracial Families

Message from the Guest Editor

We invite contributors to examine the ways in which white privilege impacts any and all members of multiracial families, including family members who are white-appearing and therefore have access to (some) white privilege, but might not identify as white. We define multiracial families broadly, including interracial couples, monoracial parents raising multiracial children, and families with transracial adoptees. We also welcome research that explores when family members, such as partners or multiracial children or adults, call attention to and/or resist white privilege in multiracial families. Additionally, we are interested in studies in which white privilege is restricted as a result of a white person being in an interracial relationship and/or multiracial family.
