The Special Issue follows the lines of inquiry established by Christine Sleeter's arguments for 'critical family history', applying these to the particular locations and experiences of settler colonial families. Critical settler family history brings together the genealogical work of family history and critical scholarship, centring on the lives of individual settler families to illuminate the structures, processes and power relations of settler colonial societies. Such explorations of family and socital histories may reflects on the past to consider the question of settler descendant identities and social locations in the present and responsibilities towards a decolonial future.
