Cattle are the most widespread species of large ruminants. They have incredibly high economic value and provide us with meat, milk, leather, and other useful products. With the development of biotechnology, molecular biology, genetics, and bioinformatics, multi-omics approaches are commonly used to reveal the mechanisms underlying bovine milk performance, reproductive traits, beef quality, growth traits, disease resistance, and other important traits from the DNA level (such as polymorphisms and chromosome modification), RNA level (ncRNA, alternative splicing, and RNA modification), and protein level (protein phosphorylation and acetylation).
