Genetics of Tubulopathies

Message from the Guest Editors

One of the key tasks of the kidney is homeostasis, the maintenance of the extracellular fluid in which all cells are bathed. Ensuring the proper composition and volume of this “milieu interieur” or internal environment is critical for the function of all cells. Homeostasis is mainly provided by the renal tubules and involves a large number of different transport proteins and regulators. Defects in these tubular transport processes are collectively referred to as tubulopathies. The associated clinical phenotype can vary enormously in severity: from minor abnormalities in urine composition, to kidney stones, hypertension, chronic kidney disease, or life-threatening acid-base and electrolyte abnormalities. Genetic investigations into these rare disorders have clarified the aetiology of most tubulopathies and provided tremendous insights into their underlying pathophysiology. This Special Issue focuses on the genetics and genomics underlying the diseases of tubulopathy, to better understand the disease causes and mechanisms and to identify and develop better treatments.
