Genomic selection has been widely studied and applied in breeding improved layers and broilers. This Special Issue aims to highlight recent advances in poultry genetics and breeding in various fields. Broad topic areas include phenomics, genetics, genomics, functional genomics, metabolomics, omics data application, gene editing, genomic selection, genetic evaluation, and genomic prediction in poultry. Contributions by experts in the field in the form of research papers and critical reviews are invited.
