This Special Issue aims to explore the impact of bias-based bullying on children, adolescents, and young people, along with the risk and protective factors involved and educational programs and prevention and intervention strategies that can be implemented. We welcome empirical studies with quantitative or qualitative approaches, intervention studies, high-quality systematic reviews, and meta-analytic papers that address these issues.
