Message from the Guest Editors

Non-communicable diseases associated with the lack of physical activity of the population worldwide have been thoroughly documented over the last few decades. Various series of manuscripts (e.g. in The Lancet 2012) and 2016) have generated guidelines to reduce physical inactivity and to encourage a more active lifestyle for disease prevention.
