Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is a debilitating but subtle psychiatric problem. It frequently affects groups vulnerable to different types of abuse (e.g., children, women, and older adults), as well as individuals exposed to severe stressful events, such as the COVID-19 pandemic, wars, natural and man-made disasters, etc. Individuals' responses to trauma vary as a function of their resilience and internal coping mechanisms as well as sociodemographic, genetic, and cultural factors. For a substantial proportion of victims, PTSD is rarely reported, detected, or managed. This Special Issue welcomes original research, short communications, reviews, and viewpoints, which aim to broaden our understanding of etiopathology, clinical diagnosis, and treatment of PTSD.
