# Transimperial Dynamics: Early Modern to Modern Age Entanglements in the Old Empires

### Message from the Guest Editors

We are opening a call for articles for a Special Issue in the journal *Histories*, on the following topic: Hegemony in the imperial histories of the Dutch, English, French and German empires tends to blur the experience of those other older empires—such as the Habsburg, Ottoman and Russian empires in addition to the Portuguese and Hispanic empires—that transitioned between the early modern and modern periods, maintaining themselves in the midst of growing international competition. Given this background, this Special Issue addresses the dynamics of imperial settings, which, from the 1700s to the 1900s, had to undertake important cultural and institutional transformations to be able to adapt to the challenges posed by emerging powers in the context of the rise of capitalism, liberal revolutions and the establishment of national states.
