#### Message from the Guest Editor

The journal Humanities, an open-access online publication, is calling for papers whose topics explore these past and future "cracks in history" over the long arc of settler colonial presence in North America. We especially invite authors who think critically about these movements, placing them in historical and literary perspective, and framing them within traditional Indigenous practices, and using Native American and Indigenous studies methodologies to unpack their significance. These movements might pertain to social conditions, sovereignty. environmental justice, MMIW, Land Back, Standing Rock, Indian boarding school histories and repatriation, etc.
