This Special Issue welcomes theoretical and empirical contributions and is open to any subject area related to the solar, geomagnetic, and cosmic environments on health, mental and emotional processes, behavior and interconnectivity. We invite research that explores the relationships between global behaviors and the synchronization of various physiological rhythms with solar and geomagnetic activity. The majority of research conducted thus far has focused on how solar flares and disruptions in the earth's magnetic fields are associated with adverse effects on health and behaviors. However, growing evidence also suggests that some solar and magnetic energy influxes have positive biological and behavioral effects and that the earth's magnetic fields helps to synchronize, energize and nonlocally interconnect living systems.
