We are particularly interested in original research articles (empirical and theoretical) or systematic reviews that explore the determinants of health disparities or inequities in populations. We will also consider quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods research that examines the distribution of health disparities or assesses the impacts of policies and interventions on improving disparities. It is imperative that every manuscript considered for publication focuses on social vulnerability, social determinants of health, and/or health inequity.
