Message from the Guest Editor

Researchers, practitioners, and educators are invited to submit manuscripts related to any area of migrant health, focusing on community-based interventions and/or policy. We will consider original quantitative and qualitative research articles, as well as review articles and articles about pilot studies (reviews should have a length of at least 4000 words, excluding references and tables). We also invite critical reflections and commentaries regarding the methodological and ethical challenges of conducting research and implementing interventions among this population. Manuscripts on the following topics are especially welcome (although all relevant papers will be considered): improving healthcare services, trauma and mental health, immigration and labor laws, the protection of migrant workers, occupational health, poverty and inequities, reduction of public resentment/discrimination, gender-based violence, sex work, migrants as brides, resettlement, and the reintegration of migrants who return home.
