# Understanding Health Risks and Protective Factors in Youth Delinquency

### Message from the Guest Editors

The focus of the Special Issue will be on the implications of delinquent behavior on health, development, and well-being, but papers do not need to be specific to youth involved with the juvenile justice system. Relevant topics relevant include, but are not limited to, youth substance use and abuse; health consequences of youth-perpetrated violence and violence exposure; social determinants of health in youth at risk for delinquency; health and delinquency implications of bullying and victimization in children and adolescents; the impacts of trauma and child adversity on delinquency and health outcomes; resilience, prosocial development, and psychosocial and biological protective factors; animal models of aggression and impulsivity with implications for health outcomes; genetic investigations of mental and physical health outcomes within populations at risk for justice-system involvement; brain correlates shared between health risk behaviors and delinquency; physical and mental health outcomes in delinquent or justice-involved youth; trans-diagnostic factors in psychopathology in youth at risk for delinquency; and shared correlates of delinquency and health disparities.
