## Message from the Guest Editor

The management of chronic diseases requires going beyond the sole perspective of medicalized health, in particular because of repercussions in the daily life of patients and their environment. A complex understanding of the processes at the individual level of both patient and stakeholder (relatives, health professionals, employers, public authorities, etc.) as well as at a structural level is necessary to plan solutions for the future. To address this issue more fully, we are soliciting manuscript submissions for inclusion in this Special Issue. We welcome manuscripts that either describe the impact of chronic disease on the daily life of patients and/or actors in their environment or that focus on the complexity in the diagnostic pathway and the comprehensive care of chronic diseases. High quality research is expected, especially rigorous qualitative research highlighting the individual and structural determinants of the problem as well as the standpoints of stakeholders. Authors can refer to the guidelines identified by the EQUATOR group (Enhancing the QUAlity and Transparency of Health Research https://www.equator-network.org/) and attach the appropriate checklist.
