We firmly believe that such tools, diagnostic criteria and techniques should be specifically aimed at grasping the complexity of developmental age, rather than being simplifications of methods used for assessing adult individuals and working with them. A good assessment is an assessment that can effectively inform clinical intervention, enhancing the rich clinical literature already existing with empirical research aimed at further understanding children's and adolescents' psychological functions and characteristics.
