Message from the Guest Editors

This Special Issue of the IJERPH is entitled "Risk Reduction for Health Prevention". The Special Issue will bring together the two concepts of prevention and risk reduction, which are key to successful public health strategies. Both prevention and risk reduction minimize the negative effects on individuals' health of changes in living conditions or specific behaviors, as well as reduce morbidity and mortality at the population level. The Special Issue will address preventative and risk reduction strategies that reduce the public health impacts of a broad spectrum of threats, including infectious diseases, climate change, hazardous working conditions, drug use and unhealthy food.
