Message from the Guest Editors

Original submissions to be considered for publication in this Special Issue may address physical activity in international special population subgroups including (but not limited to) people living with chronic disease/conditions and/or disability, as well as underserved, under-resourced, economically disadvantaged, vulnerable and/or marginalized populations (e.g., poverty, uninsured, racial/ethnic groups, immigrants/migrants, religious groups, rural communities, etc.).

Research may address patterns or change in physical activity in special population subgroups, including the relationship of physical activity to chronic disease/disability or other health behaviors/outcomes, and/or barriers or facilitators for physical activity participation, among other themes and topics relating to physical activity and public health. Research can involve reviews, secondary data analyses, or original data collection with interventions, cross-sectional, observational, and longitudinal studies. We will also consider commentaries and concept papers. Studies utilizing quantitative and/or qualitative research will be considered.
