Message from the Guest Editors

Contamination and food poisoning pose a substantial safety risk to consumers worldwide. This reinforces the importance of preventing and reducing inherent risks and adapting food programs, optimizing and monitoring systems along the entire food chain, from production to consumption. In addition, chemical and microbial contamination, and food fraud have a huge economic impact due to product loss, increased production costs, or loss of consumer confidence.
