According to World Health Organization, Universal Health Coverage (UHC) means that all people have access to the health services that they need without financial difficulties, including the full range of essential health services, from health promotion to prevention, treatment, rehabilitation, and palliative care. UHC is identified as Target 3.8: "Achieve universal health coverage, including financial risk protection, access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medicines and vaccines for all".
