Message from the Guest Editors

Substantial progress has been made in the past two decades in improving women's health, with a substantial reduction in maternal mortality. However, societies, especially in limited resource settings, are still facing the heavy burden of women's morbidity. For instance, the prevalence of gestational diabetes mellitus, one of the most common pregnancy complications, has increased by more than 30% within one or two decades in a number of countries including developing countries, forming an emerging worldwide epidemic. Additionally, social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantages continue to contribute to sex disparities in women's health.

This Special Issue seeks research papers on various aspects of women's health such as physical and mental health issues, and healthcare access and utility throughout the lifespan in different communities and countries. In particular, we encourage submissions of interdisciplinary work and multi-country collaborative research. We welcome original research papers of different study designs as well as systematic reviews and meta-analysis.
