Women's pain (e.g., menstrual pain, sexual pain) continues to be dismissed, as in the case of women with endometriosis or vulvodynia, and the negative consequences of pain normalization, for instance in terms of diagnostic delays, are well known. Moreover, both women and doctors are reluctant to address and discuss sexual issues during medical visits. In this complex contemporary scenario, women's psychological and sexual health deserves particular attention.
