Message from the Guest Editor

This Special Issue will consider the relationship between the COVID-19 pandemic and the physical and mental wellbeing of employees and trainees; experiences of particular occupational groups and sectors (including students in higher education as the future workforce); psychosocial risk factors; organisational interventions for workforce support; the engagement of line managers in workplace health initiatives, promoting healthy lifestyles at work; digital approaches to supporting employee health and wellbeing or facilitate pandemic-related shifts to remote working; and the prevention or management of chronic conditions at work and issues of equality, diversity, and inclusion in the context of COVID-19. This may include the experiences and outcomes of workplace SARS-CoV-2 testing and vaccination programmes, and supportive interventions to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19 on the mental and physical health of the current and future workforce.
