# Message from the Guest Editors

Child abuse remains a pervasive and underreported global issue with profound and lasting consequences for individual and population health. Its impact extends far beyond childhood, contributing to a wide range of longterm physical, psychological, and social problems, including chronic diseases, mental health disorders, substance abuse, and impaired educational and economic outcomes. Despite growing recognition of the adverse effects of early trauma, child abuse often remains hidden due to social stigma, systemic failures, and limitations in detection and reporting mechanisms. This Special Issue aims to advance interdisciplinary research that explores the multifaceted dimensions of child abuse and its long-term public health consequences. We welcome contributions that examine prevalence, risk and protective factors, prevention strategies, trauma-informed care, and the role of health, education, and social service systems in addressing abuse and mitigating its effects. Studies focusing on vulnerable populations, intergenerational impacts, policy responses, and innovative intervention models are particularly encouraged.
