Message from the Guest Editors

The problem of the impact of aviation on our everyday life can be solved in the context of modeling the environmental response to rising air pollutants due to increasing air traffic. New approaches and advanced technologies can be developed and employed to understand the role of aviation emissions in the climate change response, taking into account existing emission trends. Modeling results will be supported by measuring the absorption and radiative properties (single particle albedo and multi-particle scattering from in-situ measurements) of soot/nitric acid/water particles emitted at high and low altitudes, and/or by ground-based measurements at airports. This Special Issue is open to any subject area related to climate change research, environmental research, aerospace research, the impact of aviation, aviation education, and air traffic management. The keywords listed suggest just a few of the many possibilities.
