Message from the Guest Editors

Rehabilitation is one of five main health strategies and an integral part of Universal Health Coverage. However, the World Report on Disability that was published by the WHO in 2011 provided strong evidence that around the world a huge number of persons in need of rehabilitation do not have access to rehabilitation services. Ten years later it is important to look at changes, new epidemiological data, rehabilitation concepts, and their integration into health systems. The Special Issue "Rehabilitation in Health Systems, Rehabilitation Needs, and Innovative Rehabilitation Programs" is opened for scientific papers addressing these topics: the integration of rehabilitation in health systems; rehabilitation needs; outcomes of rehabilitation programs are welcome. Methodological papers are also welcome. The Editors will be happy if rehabilitation concepts in low- and lower-middle-income countries including community-based rehabilitation can be included in the Special Issue. Papers on vulnerable groups and rare diseases are welcome too. The papers of the Special Issue can contribute to WHO's initiative "Rehabilitation 2030—a Call for Action".
