Message from the Guest Editors

Restorative environments, that is, environments that facilitate the recovery of resources (biological, cognitive, psychological, and social) in individuals, have become an important research field in environmental psychology. An increasing number of studies from different areas indicate that exposure to natural environments can improve people's wellbeing. This Special Issue focuses on a specific kind of performance, that is, safety performance. From a behavioral perspective, safety performance has been traditionally conceptualized distinguishing between safety compliance (the behavioral adhesion to the formal safety protocols and regulations in the workplace) and safety participation (the active individual contribution in support to the organizational safety programs). We invite safety researchers from many perspectives to share empirical research on the role of nature in affecting safety performance and safety outcomes in general, at work.
