# Health Promotion for Sexual Health and Prevention of HIV

### Message from the Guest Editors

The past decades have seen great improvements in sexual health promotion and HIV prevention worldwide. However, to reverse the HIV epidemic, poor sexual health and its drivers must continually be tackled. Indeed, the major impacts of HIV infection demand a strong response from researchers, professionals, policy-makers and affected communities to address the problem and seek solutions to improve, in particular, the sexual health of vulnerable populations. Key vulnerable populations affected by HIV are those with a higher risk of exposure in combination with interpersonal, socio-political and cultural contexts. It is broadly acknowledged that HIV infection is influenced by multiple complex and interrelated factors. A better understanding of the demographic, socioeconomic and network factors as well as the cultural, structural and political contexts that influence sexual health risks is needed to effectively develop, implement and evaluate targeted and tailored sexual health promotion and HIV prevention interventions.
