The unmet needs in prostate cancer diagnosis and therapy are diverse; there is an urgent need for biomarkers that can be used for the early diagnosis of patients with clinically significant prostate cancer. Significant steps forward are made and are reviewed in this issue. Once metastasized, there is still no effective treatment, let stand alone a curative therapy. A better understanding of sustained androgen receptor signaling in CRPC has now led to more effective therapies. Identification of cancer initiating cells and therapies targeted to eradicate these population(s) are the way forward to combat this disease.
