A first retinal gene therapy medicine has recently been approved by regulatory agencies and other studies are ongoing in the clinic, but there are many more retinal disease genes without an available medicine. The retina is well accessible for gene therapy and transplantation of retinal cells. Neural retina and retinal pigment epithelium (RPE) can be generated from induced pluripotent stem cells (hiPSC) and used for pre-clinical studies.
