Patients on MHD suffer many physical and psychological symptoms and have many comorbidities, a bad quality of life, and an increased risk of short- and long-term mortality. The most distressing conditions affecting patients on MHD are the symptom burden and related reduced quality of life, impaired cognitive function, fatigue and post-dialysis fatigue, frustrating attempts to limit interdialytic weight gain, symptoms of depression and anxiety, frailty and related increased mortality, the need for polypharmacy and hospitalizations, and dietary restrictions. This Special Issue will focus on these distressing conditions and the strategies to overcome them.
