# Advances in Thrombosis and Haemostasis

### Message from the Guest Editor

Excessive activation of the blood coagulation system can cause thrombosis. However, new medical knowledge has changed the classical paradigm, making it increasingly apparent that the type of thrombosis associated with inflammation (thromboinflammation or immunothrombosis) often occurs in a broad range of vascular diseases, such as venous thromboembolism (VTE), atherosclerosis, and stroke. Importantly, recent studies have identified factors that contribute to thrombosis but not necessarily to haemostasis. The recent experiences of the COVID-19 pandemic also highlight the pathologic interplay between coagulation and immunity. From this perspective, this Special Issue wants to provide a comprehensive review of the current knowledge on immunothrombotic processes relevant to different clinical conditions, as the recent advances in our understanding of the drivers of immunothrombosis provide new opportunities for the development of safer anticoagulant drugs.
