Message from the Guest Editor

Coronary heart disease (CAD) is one of the most threatening cardiovascular diseases to human health. How to choose the best antithrombotic regimen has always been the focus of clinical research. Patients requiring combined anticoagulation and antiplatelet therapy are clinically difficult to manage, and the management of CAD patients with complex clinical features remains demanding due to the risk of ischemic and bleeding events, due to multiple comorbidities and/or complex interventional procedures.
