Message from the Guest Editor

Reproductive epidemiology is a rapidly growing field focused on the distribution, determinants and sequelae of reproductive and/or perinatal events. It is driven both by the impact of living conditions early in life and in utero, and by the long-term health consequences following these exposures. An additional unique feature of studies in the field of reproductive epidemiology is the inclusion of families and not only single individuals, and such studies may extend over several generations.
