Message from the Guest Editor

Male Sexual and Reproductive Health is an important issue worldwide. Approximately 20%–30% of adult men have at least one sexual dysfunction (SD). Among these, erectile dysfunction and premature ejaculation are the most frequent. In addition, couple infertility affects 15-20% of couples worldwide.

Alongside aging and organic causes, i.e., vasculogenic, neurogenic, endocrinological, metabolic, osteoporosis, etc., also psychological causes could impair Sexual and Reproductive Health.

In addition, incorrect lifestyle (i.e., psychological stress, inadequate physical activity, high scrotal temperature, etc.), environmental factors and nutritional habits could play an important role both in the development of SD as well as infertility.

The investigation of all these aspects could be useful to ameliorate the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of the patients.

Therefore, this Special Issue will explore SD and infertility etiology, comorbidity and management based on a combination of original research and review papers.
