Message from the Guest Editors

In the last two decades, stroke rehabilitation has revealed itself as a multidisciplinary field. Some of those have currently reached a sufficient level of evidence to be included in international guidelines. Moreover, the pandemic years have highlighted the need to consider home-based approaches via tele-rehabilitation. All in all, this technological invasion has promoted an improvement in the methods of outcome assessment and definition of outcome predictors, which capitalize on the technological and neuroscientific advancements derived from such a plethora of studies.
