Vestibular medicine centers around the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of patients with dizziness and vertigo, and, in all these fields, there has been an enormous expansion of research in recent years, the best of which we seek to collate in this Special Issue. New methods of treatment, frequently administered at tertiary referral centers, include both common drugs and uncommon medications that have been demonstrated to be applicable to these types of disorder. On the other hand, surgery, requiring precise anatomical knowledge, being applicable for disabling and unresponsive forms of disease, with new vestibular implants representing a way to solve the most disabling situations when both vestibular systems are nonfunctional. Topics that are welcome in this Special Issue include, but are not limited to, the epidemiology of dizziness, the role of genetics in the development of vestibulopathy, diagnostic approaches, and interventions for patients with dizziness and vertigo, such as medical treatment, surgery, and vestibular rehabilitation.
