# Segmentectomy and Lobectomy in Early-Stage Lung Cancer Management

### Message from the Guest Editor

The surgical management of early-stage non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC) has long regarded lobectomy as the standard of care. However, segmentectomy—an anatomical sublobar resection that preserves more pulmonary parenchyma—has gained increasing attention as an oncologically acceptable alternative for select patients. This Special Issue aims to explore contemporary evidence and evolving perspectives on segmentectomy and lobectomy for early-stage NSCLC. We welcome submissions that provide novel insights, refine patient selection strategies, evaluate perioperative and long-term outcomes, or challenge existing paradigms in thoracic oncology. **Scope of the Special Issue** Submissions may include but are not limited to

- Comparative studies of lobectomy vs. segmentectomy;
- Surgical techniques and innovations in anatomical segmentectomy;
- Imaging, AI, and preoperative planning for sublobar resection;
- Lymph node dissection strategies in limited resections;
- Risk stratification tools for surgical decision-making;
- Real-world data and guideline implementation.
