# Optimizing Outcomes in Pancreato-Biliary Care: Integrating Technology, Technique, and Personalized Approaches

## Message from the Guest Editor

Pancreato-biliary (PB) diseases remain among the most complex areas of digestive health, requiring high-level expertise, rapid decision-making, and coordinated multidisciplinary care. While major advances in hepatopancreato-biliary surgery, interventional endoscopy, and interventional radiology have expanded therapeutic options, outcome variability persists. Innovation alone is not sufficient: true progress occurs when technology, refined technique, and personalized care are integrated into cohesive pathways. Minimally invasive pancreatic surgery, EUS-guided interventions, robotics, advanced imaging, and Al-assisted diagnostics are reshaping PB practice. However, their impact depends on thoughtful implementation, structured training, and careful patient selection. Parallel to this, the shift toward personalized and value-based care-including multidisciplinary boards, tailored peri-interventional management, and patient-reported outcomes—is improving recovery, safety, and long-term quality of life. This Special Issue focuses on how synergy across disciplines and approaches can optimize PB outcomes.
