Acne, rosacea, and hidradenitis suppurativa (formerly called acne inversa) are skin diseases which share similar features such as redness, papules, nodules. All can result in reduced self-esteem, anxiety, and depression. With the recent advent of molecular biology and next-generation sequencing (NGS), knowledge on the skin microbiota in these skin conditions has grown exponentially. Additionally, the potential involvement of insulin-like growth factor (IGF)-1 has been suggested in acne, rosacea and hidradenitis suppurativa which opens the possibility for new treatment. Biologics and JAK-inhibitors are also a promising option and should be further examined. We herein welcome papers which provide exciting new insights on acne, rosacea, and hidradenitis suppurativa.
