Ocular surface diseases range from mild forms of keratoconjunctivitis sicca to severe conditions, such as corneal ulcer that impair cornea's transparency. In such cases, keratoplasty may be required to restore ocular integrity and/or to rehabilitate the patient's vision. Optimization of the ocular surface prior to surgery is essential to achieve success and includes maximizing tear function, restoring normal lid anatomy and function, and ensuring an adequate supply of limbal stem cells. These vital steps help to enhance the survival and clarity of the subsequent corneal graft. We invite researchers to submit original research and review articles on cutting-edge treatments for the management of cornea and ocular surface diseases.
