However, it can affect people of all ages and has been found in men and animals, as well as fetuses. Unfortunately, typically 7–10 years pass until a diagnosis is made. This Special Issue provides an excellent opportunity for a thorough analysis of the pathophysiology of the disease, the signs and symptoms, and the type of pain. Categories of endometriosis can be identified, and conservative and surgical techniques can be provided. An important research area is the pain correlated with endometriosis. The suppression of inflammatory mediators by inhibiting their synthesis might offer novel and effective treatments for the inflammatory pain in endometriosis.
