# Clinical Advances in Treatment for Venous Thromboembolism

### Message from the Guest Editors

Venous thromboembolism (VTE), comprising deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and pulmonary embolism (PE), is a common and potentially fatal disease. A key concern in treating VTE is determining the optimal duration of anticoagulation in order to prevent its recurrence. According to recent evidence, this should be tailored to each patient by weighing up the risk of a recurrence of VTE and the risk of bleeding. Although there have been significant advances in VTE management, several uncertainties continue to challenge clinicians in everyday practice, such as VTE associated with cancer, VTE in unusual-sites, antiphospholipid syndrome, and minor cases, such as subsegmental pulmonary embolism and distal deep vein thrombosis. These areas require further research, and several clinical trials are currently underway to address them. This Special Issue will be devoted to these topics, and we invite all interested authors to submit papers on “Clinical Advances in Treatment for Venous Thromboembolism”.
