Congenital Bleeding Disorders: Diagnosis, Treatment and Future Opportunities

Message from the Guest Editors

Congenital bleeding disorders are a group of highly heterogeneous conditions impairing primary or secondary haemostasis. In recent decades, the knowledge about these disorders has greatly improved, leading to the discovery of new disorders as well as to the comprehension of the pathogenic mechanisms of known disorders. In addition, major advances have been obtained in the diagnostic field as well in the identification of novel, effective therapeutic options. However, congenital bleeding disorders still suffer from the typical disadvantages of orphan diseases, making their early recognition remain complicated, and some therapeutic opportunities are still problematic.

In this Special Issue, we invite submissions that focus on the natural history and pathogenesis of congenital disorders of primary and secondary haemostasis and the state of the art in the diagnosis and management of these disorders. Submissions can be in the form of reviews providing insights into the current knowledge and technical knowledge as well as original research that addresses the key questions being asked in this area, with particular emphasis on the diagnostic and therapeutic perspectives.
