Over the subsequent decade after the Surviving Sepsis Campaign, hospital mortality of sepsis decreased substantially. However, this tremendous success created a new problem: A growing epidemic of “sepsis survivors” are now progressing into chronic critical illness (CCI). These include increased cardiovascular events, malnutrition, sepsis recidivism, immobility, neuropathy, and frailty, as well as impaired host cognition and a suboptimal host microbiome. This Special Issue will describe these disorders and discuss potential interventions to minimize risk, maximize recovery, and prevent long-term mortality. These articles will work towards promoting multidisciplinary discussion and aid the focus of future research.
