Message from the Guest Editor

Reconstruction within the head and neck is challenging. Defects can be anatomically complex and may already be compromised by scarring, inflammation, and infection. Tissue grafts and vascularised flaps (either pedicled or free) bring healthy tissue to a compromised wound for optimal healing and are the current gold standard for the repair of such defects. However, several disadvantages limit the availability of these procedures, for example, the difficulty in shaping the flap to fit the defect and, most importantly, donor site morbidity. In addition, the importance of aesthetics, besides function, has driven advances in the accuracy of surgical techniques. The aim of this Special Issue is to discuss current advances in reconstruction within oral and maxillofacial surgery, and we are pleased to invite you to submit your valuable contributions for the scientific progress of this project.
